
waterslide, outdoor pool to enjoy on those hot summer days, and a variety of sports fields.

The event draws hundreds of hunters from across Canada and the United States to Taber.

Taber Winter Festival



Taber Regional Economic Development


Positioned in the midst of rich farm land, the Taber region thrives on food processing and other agricultural services. With record amounts of sunshine, the irrigated fields and excellent soil conditions support a large variety of crops. This has enabled the agri-processing industries to become diverse in the Taber region. With a growing food processing industry, the region has used unique approaches regarding the development of infrastructure, as water and waste water requirements are often quite robust to support value-added processing. Several of the main crops and livestock originating from the Taber area include hogs, beef, sheep, poultry, sugar beets, potatoes, onions, canola, mustard, oats, beans, corn, flax, barley, wheat, carrots, and peas



The Taber Region is well-connected, as it is located along a variety of major highways. The Town of Taber is located at the junction of two major highways – Highway 3 and Highway 36 – creating transportation links to other major markets. Highway 36 runs north/south through the MD of Taber, linking Taber and Vauxhall, while connecting the region to northern Alberta and the US Border. Highway 3 links the Taber Region with the BC and Saskatchewan borders, while Highway 25 is also an important transportation route within the MD of Taber. A few of the major markets located nearby are the cities of Lethbridge, Medicine Hat, and Calgary, as well as the United States Border, just an hour south of Taber. This has enabled the region to be an ideal home for those searching for a small community with easy access to larger centres. The connections make the region a strategic place for business, due to proximity to larger markets, while offering affordable land and development prices.




Income of Households aged 15 years & over, 2016




Canada's Premier Food Corridor

Recognized as a hub for food processing, many global companies are already located in the Taber Region. The logistics and transportation supply chains have led to a growing number of niche innovators choosing to build their businesses here in Southern Alberta.

The Taber Region is focused on supporting and encouraging business development in a few key industries, such as agri-food processing, plant proteins, and the services to support the growing high-tech ag sector. There are almost 3,100 farms in the region, with an increasing interest in growing and processing protein-based crops to take advantage of the exploding world market for proteins. A significant portion of Alberta's pulse crops are grown here, including yellow peas, fava beans, chickpeas, and a variety of other beans. There is alos a large volume of hemp grown in the region.


The Taber Region has been heavily involved in initiatives such as Protein Industries Canada (PIC), a federally funded super-cluster that is led by industry, research, and non-profit organizations to position Canada as a global source of highquality plant protein and plant-based co-products. The Region is proud to be the home and headquarters of Rowland Farms, one of Canada's largest hemp producers and a partner in



Using crops such as canola and hemp, the project will introduce new highprotein ingredients into the global food, feed, and aquaculture markets.

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Residential opportunities are flourishing in the region with growing residential developments throughout the MD of Taber, Town of Taber and Town of Vauxhall. The Town of Taber is also in the process of planning for an affordable housing residential subdivision that will feature a variety of development standards that will facilitate the expansion of affordable housing units in the market. This development will also help to support the needs of the growing industrial and commercial base throughout the region, as more employees are needed to continue to support growth.

In the past, single family dwellings have dominated the residential areas but recently there has been a shift to incorporate different types of housing. With more options,

















The beginning of Taber starts in the late 1890s, with the settlement of homesteaders and the arrival of Mormon settlers from the United States, in 1903. A hamlet was established along the Medicine Hat-Lethbridge railway, with the economy supported by coal mining. A post-office was later established by the Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) and the hamlet's name was changed from Tank #77 to Tabor. However the paperwork for the post office came back printed as Taber instead. When the hamlet was incorporated into the Province of Alberta on July 1, 1907, the name was officially changed to Taber.

The Taber region thrived on coal mining. The coal was mined in Taber and then shipped down the Oldman River on barges to Medicine Hat, with it later being transported by narrow gauge railway. However, the coal mining industry dramatically declined in 1913, with the opening of new coal mines in the Drumheller area. This forced the smaller mines in Taber to close. Taber's economy reinvigorated itself though in the 1920s with the extensive development of irrigation in Southern Alberta. The irrigation allowed for crops to be grown in the region without fear of drought. The success of the irrigation system grew the agricultural economy, which helped contribute to the establishment of a vegetable canning plant in 1934. The opening of the vegetable canning plant was the start of the agri-food processing industry in the community. Sugar beets also became a popular crop in the Taber area and in 1950, a sugar beet processing plant was opened. Today the agricultural industry still has deep roots within the community because of the development of the irrigation system and the establishment of agri-food processing plants.

Agriculture isn't the only industry which established deep roots within Taber's economy, as the oil and gas industry has grown significantly over the years. Oil was first discovered in the Taber

area in 1937, which diversified the economy and allowed the community to not so heavily rely on agriculture. Today both the agricultural and oil and gas industries have created a stable economy within the community.







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
